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Highlighted Project 1 Waste Recycling Concept

In late 2023, as part of their sustainability concept, Forster Rohner AG and Jakob Schlaepfer AG, together with Stiftung GRS Batterien and GRS Service GmbH, have launched a recycling concept for PES waste that occurs when producing sequins. This project is due to be implemented by the end of 2024.

For several years already most of the sequins used by Forster Rohner AG and Jakob Schlaepfer AG have been made, either partially or completely, out of recycled PES foil materials. This switch towards recycled PES sequins could be done without a compromise regarding looks. Our sequins out of recycled PES are sparkling, colourful and magic as ever! Having said so, one downside remains to be solved still: when punching the sequins out of foil material a lot of waste occurs. This waste of originally high quality PES material so far has to be disposed of. Together with Stiftung GRS Batterien and GRS Service GmbH as well as our supplier of the foil material an initiative was launched with the goal to collect this the high-quality PES-based waste during the manufacturing process and to recycle and reuse the PES material completely. Currently, product data from the PES used are being analysed and evaluated. As medium-term milestone the waste shall be reused as recycled raw material by external PES producers in general.

As long-term milestone PES waste for production of sequins shall serve again as raw-material for new sequins production. Ultimate goal is a circular economy where waste does not have to be disposed of but rather can flow back into the production cycle of sequins themselves. This product cycle shall be certified by an independent audit finally in order to grant full transparency over the process as well as its results.



Highlighted Project 2

Update on the Promotion of Renewable Energy

The climate change crisis is among the greatest threats and challenges to human health. Climate change is caused by an increase of carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases in the earth's atmosphere, mainly due to fossil fuel emissions.

In the Paris Agreement, countries around the world have pledged to limit global warming to below 2°C (3.6°F) - and preferably to 1.5°C (2.7°F) – by reducing their emissions.

The Climate Policy of Switzerland targets a net zero carbon emission by 2050. This is a challenge and an ambitious target but it is our responsibility to take part as actively as possible in the process of reducing carbon emissions.

Our two pillars for reducing emissions are investments in renewable energy on the one hand and energy savings on the other. Transitioning from fossil fuels, which currently account for the lion's share of emissions, to renewable energy is key to addressing the climate crisis. Our comprehensive building renovation campaign started in 2022 and continues to this day. During this time Forster Rohner has invested heavily in solar energy. In total, more than 2`600 m2 of roof area has been covered with solar panels at our sites in Switzerland, Romania, Bosnia and China. The overall investment amounts to a high six-figure Swiss Franc sum. The total annual power output reaches more than 650 MWh, resulting in a CO2 saving of more than 50 tons.

In addition, Forster Rohner has replaced all outdated windows in its 60-year-old main building in Switzerland with highly energy-efficient ones by 2023. Additional insulation material was added to the walls and the building's electricity system was updated. Finally, in April 2024 the headquarters and production halls in Switzerland will be connected to the newly constructed local district heating system. This will also make the old fossil fuel-based heating system completely redundant.

District Heating


In the Energy Concept 2050 of the city of St. Gallen, district heating is considered an important pillar of the heat supply, with which the following goals are to be achieved:

2020: coverage of 15% of the city's heat demand by district heating.

By 2050: yearly expansion and densification of the district heating network.

From 2050: coverage of 50% of the urban heat demand by district heating.

District heating is the central supply of buildings with heating and hot water. In St. Gallen, it originates from the waste heat of the waste incineration plant, from the waste heat of their own gas-fired combined heat and power plants, which also produce electricity, as well as from the heat production of wood boilers and gas-fired boilers, which can also be converted to oil operation.






Social Engagement outside the company Engaging with Local Institutions, Events and Inhabitants
